DISSOLUTION OF REGION 2 UNIT - From Rich Short, Region 2 President

This is to inform you the Central Maryland Unit #166 of Region 2 has officially been dissolved and has returned its charter to Airstream Club Headquarters.

Rune and Robin Moeller #21090 were the last actively elected officers of the Central Maryland Unit and they did their best to keep the CMU rolling. You will remember the wonderful job they did organizing and running the 2019 R2 Rally in Biglerville, PA. But, in the end, they are only two people and couldn't keep their club going by themselves. With a dwindling membership that was no longer willing and/or able to participate as Officers or in the life of the club, there was little

alternative. I worked with Rune and Robin over the last year and appointed them CMU's Pro Tem officers to get through the dissolution process. I sincerely thank them for all of their efforts on behalf of the Central Maryland Unit both prior to and during the dissolution of the unit. They couldn't have done more.

This is not something that happened over night but as a result of events, over time, that many of our clubs experience. It is unfortunate but a reminder of the challenges in staying an active, vibrant and relevant part of the WBCCI. I don't think there is a club among us that has not experienced problems in motivating members to participate in the life and leadership of their respective clubs. Even the strongest of clubs continually need new people to step up and take active roles.

I know many of you are doing your best to keep your members engaged and your club rolling. I read your newsletters and I appreciate your efforts. But on examination and in all honesty, not all of the local clubs in our Region are thriving. Not all have newsletters. Or websites. Or if they do have a website, it has not been updated in quite some time nor integrated into the Club's new .org site. And, therein lies part of the problem. I am not trying to find fault but if we don't work to keep up, we fall farther and farther behind.

In the 10 years I've been a WBCCI member, local clubs have been provided with more tools and opportunities to develop and grow than ever before. Think about some of the improvements you've seen:

- Blue Beret goes from newspaper print to a full color magazine.
- A rebranding is accomplished to more fully embrace and improve our Airstream, Inc. relationship.
- New, colorful and modern Airstream Club logo is released. Club logo wear is made available thru Land's End website.
- We changed over to an airstreamclub.net domain for email.
- Development and implementation of the new airstreamclub.org website containing an abundance of club resources and a new "member only" portal is ready to be released.
- Ability to control your club's own presence on that website by creating a uniform, modern microsite that can be uniquely yours.
- Ability to post and edit your own calendar of events.
- A push to use one of the most valuable assets of our Club, the licensing agreement with Airstream, to incorporate Airstream Club into our names.
- Airstream sales at all time highs.
- The dissemination of contact info on all purchasers of new Airstream products, to help solicit new members.
- Monthly list of new members, including Members-At-Large, published in the Blue Beret.
- Development of a Caravan Leader Program that has resulted in more caravan leaders and more Caravans available than in recent memory.
- And now, a new push to expand tangible Member Benefits and add value to membership in the WBCCI.
- I could go on, but instead I'm going to ask you...
- How many of those improvements/events have you and your club taken advantage of?
- Do you have a newsletter?
- Do you have a website? Is it up to date and integrated into airstreamclub.org?
- Do you have a social media presence?
- Do you post and update your calendar of events on airstreamclub.org?
- Do you have a Membership Chairperson, actively recruiting new members?
- Are you using the new owners list from HQ and the material provided by Lea Plant, our R2 Membership Chair, to recruit new members?
- Prior to Covid, how many traveling camping rallies did you hold or plan to hold in 2020? (Your WBCCI charter requires a minimum of two). Luncheons? Other events?
- Do you have a club brochure that tells your club's story to prospective new members?
- Have you changed your name to include Airstream Club? (5 of our 15 R2 local clubs have not)

I could go on but I think you catch my drift. If you want to be successful, study successful clubs in and out of our Region. What are they doing to make themselves successful? Ask them. Emulate them. "Imitation is the sincerest form of flattery" and may be key to your own club's success.

We left NH on 9/16 to go to the Finger Lakes Rally. We stayed at Crazy Acres CG in Davenport, NY that evening rather than driving all the way to Bath, NY. What a great campground to have some future rally. It had a great rally field with water and electric. This was also getting into the autumn leaf peeping time, so the trees were starting to show their glory. We got to Bath, NY to meet up with the other rally goers. We left Bath, NY with the Sunde's on the 24th to travel to Tallmadge, OH where friends of ours lived and they invited us to spend two nights in their driveway. It was great to catch up with Mark and Chris and it was a perfect spot to stay to be able to visit the Rock n Roll Hall of Fame. This made it easy for us to spend the day at the museum and then go out to dinner with our overnight hosts.

Once we left, the next stop was Elkhart, IN. We stayed at Elkhart CG which was a nice central spot to be able to visit the RV/MH Museum, Indiana Dunes, Bontragers Surplus, and Grand Design. If you are ever in the Elkhart, IN area the RV/MH Museum is wonderful. There are many vintage camping units there and lots of history about camping. The Indiana Dunes is a National Park and was a stone's throw from Elkhart. The National Park is at the bottom of Lake Michigan. I was able to get a passport stamp for this park and then we went to see the dunes. It was very strange to see the dunes and the wide-open water and realizing you are not at the ocean. A day trip to Bontragers Surplus which was a huge multi building store full of surplus RV parts. There were cushions and sofas and windows and frig's and all kind of parts for an RV. If you knew what you were looking for, you could get a great deal. Last thing we did was go on an RV manufacturing tour at Grand Design. The tour we were on was for fifth wheels. We knew we couldn't go on an Airstream tour when we got to Airstream, so we took in this one. It was good to see how other RV manufacturers produce their rigs.

Our next stop was to Auburn, IN where the Auburn Cord Duesenberg Automobile Museum was. What a beautiful museum housed in an Art Deco style building. The automobiles were beautiful. This stop was especially good because we were able to overnight in the parking lot with water and electric. This is a Harvest Host site but anyone visiting the museum with an RV is welcome to stay overnight or free.

Now we are starting our way back east stopping at the Airstream Factory in Jackson Center, OH. This is affectionately known as visiting the 'Mother Ship'. They also provide parking with full hookups for overnight or as long as your Airstream service will last, if they don't have your rig in the service bays. We needed some work done on our water pump and were able to get an appointment. What was supposed to take a few hours lasted long enough for us to have to change our next campground reservations. Luckily, the issue was resolved, and we were able to leave after two nights at the factory. While we were waiting for the service to our rig to be completed, we drove into the little town of Bellafontaine, OH (pronounced Bell Fountain) which is the town with the first ever, still existing concrete road. There was a blocks length of this concrete road, which was the US first paved road ever, paved in 1893. Now there is a bit of Roadside Americana for you.

Still working our way back east to Sunde Ranch, we stopped at Barkcamp SP in Belmont, OH just west of Wheeling, WV. It was an older state park with a lot of very old short steep sites that were almost impossible to get into. We had two new primo sites with full hook ups but since we had to stay another night at the Airstream Factory, we lost those as it was now Friday, the weekend. Remember this campground so you will know, be very picky what site you are on. We finally were able to park and survived the night to move onto....

Sunde Ranch! One of my favorite places to camp. A few days there to do laundry, clean up the trailers and restock food for Installation.

WDCU INSTALLATION RALLY 10/8-10/11 at Grover's Farm was wonderful. This is also one of my favorite places to camp. Star and Peter set up a wonderful itinerary for us all. Friday we were all invited to Colonial Airstream in Millstone, NJ and they made lunch for us all. This dealership has a brand-new building which was built by Peter's company. Save the date! I'm excited to share one of my sacred spots, Walnut Hills Campground with the team. It's tucked neatly in the Shenandoah Valley within eyeshot of the majestic Blue Ridge Mountains of western Virginia. If you read my newsletter article submitted this past summer, this spot is central to my camping experience, and led me to you guys!

I've been camping here now for the last 7 years and the staff is truly family to me. More information is to follow, but I wanted to lay out the basics so you can book your reservation!

We've secured 17 sites in what I call "the hill." These are primo spots; full-hook up, with a scenic view of the mountains and the expertly groomed grounds and fishing hole below. The pull thru sites are very large and accommodating-most are buddy sites (two trailers front to back)- others are back in. Within the pull-thru buddy sites, some have deluxe patios, with a swing and gas grill. Trust me. Even with the buddy sites fully occupied, you won't feel crowded. I've secured a deluxe patio site alone-to serve as a "command post"-for fires and breakfast etc. We've also reserved a couple of singular, back in sites.

All sites; buddy or otherwise, are full-hook ups. (that we have reserved).

Should we exceed capacity, the staff will do its best to place you in another site. (not all have full hook up service)but this campground's sites are all excellent!

EACH RESERVATION MUST BE MADE INDIVIDUALLY. THERE IS NO GROUP RATE. IT IS ALSO A GOOD SAM PARK. GIVE THEM YOUR NUMBER AND GET A 10% DISCOUNT!

The rates vary according to day and type. For example, the most expensive buddy site (deluxe patio) has a Thursday rate of \$62 with a buddy charge of \$36-and for Friday and Saturday- the rate is \$65 and \$38 respectively. In this example, if you average out the rate; it comes to approximately \$50 per person. NOTE: YOU'LL HAVE TO WORK THIS OUT WITH YOUR "BUDDY" AFTER THE FACT-THE FRONT OFFICE WILL SIMPLY BOOK FOR THE RATE AS LISTED, TO TWO INDIVIDUAL TRAILERS. If two trailers know ahead of time that they want to "buddy up"-they need to call literally a few minutes within one another, with their individual information. This could get tricky. I suggest that you leave it up to the staff to work that out and accept whoever is placed as your buddy. Also, trailer length may come into play.

We literally have the entire hill to ourselves!

Reservations for this rally will be accepted from November 15, 2020 to March 1, 2021. After March 1st, the sites will be released. (if you are one-half of a buddy site that doesn't get filled, you will simply have the site to yourself).

WHEN CALLING-ASK FOR ERIKA AND SAY YOU ARE BOOKING FOR THE GALUPO RALLY. ONLY ERIKA WILL BOOK OUR PARTY (SHE IS THE CAMPGROUND MANAGER).
